

FUTURE FLOOD RISK

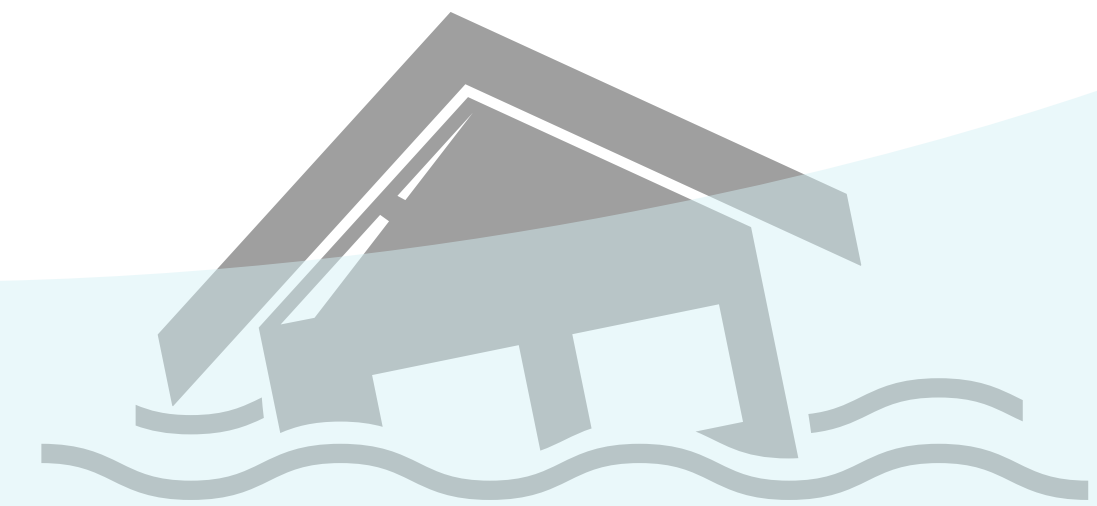
This area experienced devastating flooding during Hurricane Sandy.

What's being done to make the area more resilient against future storms and climate change?

Resilient New Jersey is partnership between NJ Department of Environmental Protection and Middlesex County communities, including Perth Amboy. These communities have experienced flooding for decades, from major storms to heavy rainfall events and stormwater flooding. The RNJ Raritan River and Bay Communities created a roadmap to reduce flood risk and increase resilience to help the region survive and thrive.

FUTURE COASTAL STORM

Perth Amboy and the surrounding region will experience more intense storms and flooding due to climate change. In a future, Sandy-like event, this area could see around 7 feet of flooding and \$65 million in losses. Future storms will be worsened by expected 2.4 feet of sea level rise.

On October 29, 2012, Hurricane Sandy caused extensive flooding and damage to this neighborhood. Extensive damage occurred to parks along the waterfront, resulting in nearly \$6 million in damages to the marina and waterfront walkways.
